





Extended code of conduct for children and young people

This is an extension of the Code of Conduct in the League rule book page 13 Bury Rounders is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. It is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with Bury Rounders should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

As a member of Bury Rounders, you are expected to abide by the following junior code of practice:

Children and young people are expected to:

- Follow and comply with all league rules and regulations.
- Be friendly and supportive all league members.
- Report inappropriate behaviour or risky situations.
- Play fairly and be trustworthy.
- Respect officials/opponents and accept official decisions.
- Not cheat or be violent and aggressive.
- Take care of equipment owned by the team.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of background
- Refrain from the use of bad language or racial/sectarian references.
- Not get involved in inappropriate peer pressure
- Refrain from bullying or persistent use of rough and dangerous play.
- Wear suitable kit; for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.

Children / Young People have the right to:

- Be safe, happy, listened to, respected and treated fairly.
- Privacy.
- Be protected from abuse by other member or outside sources.
- Participate on an equal basis, appropriate to their ability.
- Ask for help.
- Have any concerns taken seriously and acted on.

General misbehaviour will be addressed by the coach and reported to the designated person. More serious or persistent misbehaviour may result in disciplinary action and potentially dismissal from the league. Parents will be informed at all stages.
