The Welfare Team

Welfare Coordinator (WCO)

The role of the Welfare Coordinator is crucial in ensuring that BRSI is implemented. As well as:

- Dealing with welfare issues and enquiries from players, officials and committee members.
- To ensure that the League is providing a duty of care for players, officials and committee members.
- To identify and provide training opportunities to the Management Committee and League Members.
- To advise the Management Committee and League Members of the moral, ethical and legal responsibilities in respect of the welfare of others and duty of care.
- To write and update the BRSI.

Welfare Officer (TWO)

The Team Welfare Officer is a key role within Rounders. By designating people to this role, Bury Rounders can ensure that it has someone identified as the first point of contact for safeguarding concerns within a Team. All Team Welfare Officers are Level 1 Safeguarding trained, that is updated every 3 years.

Management Committee

- To deal with minor poor practice/complaints/disciplinary procedures with advice.
- To advise others within the organisation about actions they may need to take, such as initiating disciplinary proceedings.
- To monitor and review progress on all cases
- Consider all matters referred to and take proper and expedient action.
- Responsible for the administration of the League, conforming to the Constitution and League Rules, and for submitting an annual report and League accounts for the Annual General Meeting, together with further information that may be required.
