Pitch	Clashing with other pitches – participants from different games running into each other.	All Participants	Make the rounders pitch larger than normal Note: A rounders pitch in Rounders England's Official rule book is 100m x 60m	If more than one game is being played on a field then each pitch size should be increased to 15,000 sq. metres to avoid the minimal risk of the ball running into another pitch.			
Travelling to the session / game	Participants spreading COVID-19 by travelling together to rounders games.	All participants	Advise all participants to travel to the game separately or with people from within their bubble.	If this isn't possible – advise that people who travel together wear face coverings, have windows open, face away from each other and regularly sanitise hands before and after being in transport.			



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<p>Participants with Symptoms of COVID-19</p>	<p>Attending the session / game whilst symptomatic</p>	<p>All participants</p>	<p>Anyone showing symptoms of COVID-19 must self-isolate as per the Government guidance and not go to play rounders.</p>	<p>Anyone showing symptoms of COVID-19 must not attend the session/game. They should inform their COVID-19 officer immediately.</p> <p>COVID-19 Officer should inform all previous attendees who have been in contact with the symptomatic person during the last 21 days.</p>			
<p>Equipment sharing</p>	<p>Transference of COVID-19 between participants</p>	<p>All Participants</p>	<p>Advise not to share equipment / minimise equipment-sharing</p>	<p>Participants to sanitise equipment regularly.</p> <p>Bats Where bats are shared, ensure they are numbered so that the same participants use the same numbered bat throughout the game.</p> <p>Balls Where possible, use 2 balls during a game to minimise sharing between teams.</p>			



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Social Distancing	Ensuring all participants are socially distant where possible	All participants	Communicate in advance with all participants on social distancing requirements throughout arrival, warm up, game and departure.	Remind players pre match about social distancing. Mark out social distancing areas for the batters in/out.			
Hygiene and Sanitisation	To make sure participants regularly sanitise hands	All Participants	Ensure all participants know to bring their own sanitiser to the venue.	Have organised sanitising time – before during and after the session / game.			
First Aid	Close contact required (non-social distance) with injured participants	First Aider and injured participants	Make sure all First Aid kits have PPE within them	First Aider to sanitise themselves immediately once they have attended to the injured participant.			
Participants that fall within the High Risk category for COVID-19	Vulnerable people being more susceptible to contacting COVID-19	High risk participants	Advise that people who are high risk do not return to play rounders	Introduce the socially distant small-sided version of the game for high risk people.			



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Test and Trace	Assist with Track and Trace	All Participants	Covid-19 Officer to use a register to take the names, phone numbers and email addresses of all participants/ people attending the session/game.	NHS test and trace will contact the COVID-19 Officer to request the Test and Trace sheets if someone has tested positive.
